	e <u>nationality</u> and the <u>religion</u> (as stated in the birth certificate) determine the classification the student into:

	e passport of the student, which contains the residence visa, determines the classification the student into in <b>AM</b> or <b>AF</b> .
	If the <b>Arabic passport</b> of the student contains the residence visa, the student has to rticipate in <b>AM</b> .
	If the <b>non-Arabic passport</b> of the student contains the residence visa, the student can oose between <b>AM</b> or <b>AF</b> .

	e birth certificate and the passport of the student, which contains the residence visa, termine the classification of the student into <b>E</b> , <b>IA</b> or <b>IE</b> .
	Islamic Studies in Arabic (IA)
St	udents whose birth certificate state the <b>religion Islam</b> and whose residence visa is cluded in the <b>Arabic passport</b> of the student have to choose Islamic Studies in Arabic (IA).
St	Islamic Studies in English (IE) udents whose birth certificate state the religion Islam and whose residence visa is cluded in the non-Arabic passport of the student can choose between Islamic Studies in abic (IA) or Islamic Studies in English (IE).
	Ethics (E) students who are not assigned to (IA) or (IE) have to choose Ethics (E)
No	A student may switch the subject from "Ethics" to "Islamic Studies". But a switch from "Islamic Studies" to "Ethics" is not allowed by the KHDA (Knowledge and Human Development Authority).
